RESPONSIVE READING Psalm 9 (ESV)

Leader: I will give thanks to the LORD with my whole heart; I will recount all of your wonderful deeds.

ALL: I will be glad and exult in you; I will sing praise to your name, O Most High. When my enemies turn back, they stumble and perish before your presence.

Leader: For you have maintained my just cause; you have sat on the throne, giving righteous judgment. You have rebuked the nations; you have made the wicked perish; you have blotted out their name forever and ever.

ALL: The enemy came to an end in everlasting ruins; their cities you rooted out; the very memory of them has perished.

Leader: But the LORD sits enthroned forever; he has established his throne for justice, and he judges the world with righteousness; he judges the peoples with uprightness.

- Leader: The nations have sunk in the pit that they made; in the net that they hid, their own foot has been caught.
- ALL: The LORD has made himself known; he has executed judgment; the wicked are snared in the work of their own hands.

- ALL: The wicked shall return to Sheol, all the nations that forget God. For the needy shall not always be forgotten, and the hope of the poor shall not perish forever.

*SCRIPTURE READING John 11: 17-27; 38-44 (ESV)

Leader: Now when Jesus came, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb four days. Bethany was near Jerusalem, about two miles off,

- ALL: So when Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went and met him, but Mary remained seated in the house.

- ALL: Martha, the sister of the dead man, said to him, "Lord, by this time there will be an odor, for he has been dead four days."
- Leader: Jesus said to her, "Did I not tell you that if you believed you would see the glory of God?" So they took away the stone.
- ALL: And Jesus lifted up his eyes and said, "Father, I thank you that you have heard me. I knew that you always hear me, but I said this on account of the people standing around, that they may believe that you sent me."




