From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Ones,

Last weekend, Kirk, our dog Merry and me went to Madison SD to see our son and his family. We make this trip enough that we have a routine – we stop at the same gas stations, and eat at the same places. So, this trip was proceeding as usual until we stopped for gas in Westbrook. Kirk always takes Merry out for a walk when we stop, so he started pumping the gas and I snapped Merry's leash onto her halter. Kirk took Merry and I went into the station. When I came out – I saw my worst nightmare coming true. Merry's leash had somehow come unhooked and she was running free.

Now you need to know a little about Merry. We rescued her about 10 years ago from the Humane Society of the Delta. She was running down a sidewalk in Helena Arkansas when the director of the Humane Society saw her and chased her down and caught her. Merry needed emergency medical attention as she has a very large burn circling her back and one side of her hind quarters. Kate, the director, then took her home to foster her until she was ready for adoption. When I met Merry, Kate was honest and said, "She is a sweet dog, but she has had some trauma in her life and will probably never be a lap dog." At that meeting, I could tell that Merry really wanted to be loved, but was terrified. I brought her home and after months of trying to make her feel comfortable, Merry finally laid down on my feet. After that, she slowly warmed up until she would jump onto my lap. But one thing that has not changed is her reaction be "being caught". Even today, when Kirk says "Merry, do you want to go walking?" Merry will run over to Kirk, but will not allow him to snap on the leash until she has gone to a corner. She wants to go, but is scared of the "catching" part of putting on the leash, so she walks herself into a corner. Once the leach is on everything is fine.

So, back to the nightmare. When Merry realized the leash was not connected to her harness, she was terrified. She didn't run away, she stayed right with us, but when we would attempt to catch her, she would retreat. Then she would come back and stand just far enough away so we could not reach her. This went on for AN HOUR! People tried to help us, and that just made it worse. Finally, she got tired enough that she stopped in front of a fence and let me grab her. She was so relieved to be caught. I will not talk about my husband's mood while this was going on – let's just say he was less than pleased.

I think that when it comes to our relationship with God, we can be a whole lot like Merry. We want to walk with God, but the thought of being vulnerable enough to allow ourselves to be caught up in God's love can be terrifying, so, we keep ourselves at arm's length. We stay just outside of God's circle. We don't get too close, but stay close enough to feel the warmth of God's love. And God hangs around. No matter how long it takes for us to allow God to catch us – God will not leave us behind.

Cash donations will also be accepted.

Update for Faith Church Finances

The Council met in early March and reviewed the financials for 2021 along with the first two months of 2022. The full 2022 budget was approved after discussion. The Council noted that we are not paying our own way! Even though we paid our Apportionments in full for the past two years, we were not doing it with current giving levels.

In 2020, we were able to meet all our expenses including Apportionments by allowing our cash balance to go down significantly. In 2021, we were able to use about \$6000 from savings to meet all our expenses. The 2022 budget anticipates having to use another \$6000 from savings to balance the expenses against the expected giving.

So where did that savings come from? Two years ago Faith Church applied for and received some funding from the Payroll Protection Program (PPP). This was a government program to help employers maintain their staffs during the decreased income associated with the pandemic. Faith Church followed all the rules of the program and had that funding forgiven by the government while we maintained all of our staff.

At the same time, staff reduced costs as much as possible by reducing hours worked and limiting other costs wherever it could. But this supplemental funding will not last forever, and we need to increase our giving so that we get back to paying our own way. In years past, we had "Special Asks" to fill the gaps. We would prefer not having to do that again but that will depend on our giving at a level that covers our necessary expenses each year.

Ferch Family Update

This past year has been one of many blessings to us; it has also included several challenges we had to work on. It has been a year since I suffered several falls on the stairway at our house and I am happy to say that I've fully recovered and feel good. I have also had unexpected issues resulting from cataract surgeries last July and am soon going to see an eye specialist at Rochester Mayo; I don't know where that will lead. In late November we moved to Realife Senior Co-op, which is a wonderful place to be, although the process of moving from a fifty-three year tenure in our old house was probably the most difficult thing we've ever done. My firm belief is that God has had His hand in all of this...to God be the Glory. Blessed be the prayers of the faithful; please continue as we deal with this eye situation.

Easter Sunrise Service will begin at 7:30am in the sanctuary, followed by Easter breakfast and then our Easter Service at 9:30am.


