Faith's Blessing Box

We have seen increased use of our blessing box and continue to replenish the box as needed.

Recently, a cash donation for the blessing box was brought to the church office by an anonymous donor from our community.

We appreciate and are grateful for all food and cash donations for the blessing box. Your donations help us to keep this ministry going. Food donations can be placed in the donation box in the narthex or brought into the church office during office hours. Cash donations can be mailed or brought to the church with a notation that they are for the blessing box. Thank you for your donations!

Suggested food items at this time are pouched meat (chicken, pork, tuna), ramen noodles, instant mashed potatoes, rice (plain and flavored pouches or boxes), pasta, oatmeal, cold cereal. Once temperatures stay above freezing, we will put out canned goods again.

All Blessing Box items must be: shelf-stable (non-perishable), sealed and not past expiration date, able to withstand hot temperatures during the summer months, and able to withstand cold temperatures in the winter months (e.g. pouched meat instead of canned meat). <u>Please no glass jars</u>.
