The Child Isaiah 7:10-16

Again the Lord spoke to Ahaz, saying, Ask a sign of the Lord your God; let it be deep as Sheol or high as heaven. But Ahaz said, I will not ask, and I will not put the Lord to the test. Then Isaiah said: "Hear then, O house of David! Is it too little for you to weary mortals, that you weary my God also? Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Look, the young woman is with child and shall bear a son, and shall name him Immanuel. He shall eat curds and honey by the time he knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good. For before the child knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good, the land before whose two kings you are in dread will be deserted.

The Lamb Mathew 3:1-12

In those days John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness of Judea, proclaiming, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." This is the one of whom the prophet Isaiah spoke when he said,

"The voice of one crying out in the wilderness:

'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight."

Now John wore clothing of camel's hair with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. Then the people of Jerusalem and all Judea were going out to him, and all the region along the Jordan, and they were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins.

But when he saw many Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruit worthy of repentance. Do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our ancestor'; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.

"I baptize you with water for repentance, but one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor and will gather his wheat into the granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

"There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on the earth distress among nations confused by the roaring of the sea and the waves. People will faint from fear and foreboding of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in a cloud' with power and great glory. Now when these things begin to take place, stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near."

ADVENT—a time of stress and anxiety or a time of peace and joy? YOU CHOOSE.

Christmas time is coming. For you, is it a time of joy and expectation? For some, it's a difficult time, a reminder of losses, a loved one, a tradition, a relationship, an inability to provide a "perfect" Christmas for our loved ones... Advent signals a flurry of activity, with all the associated stress.

How, then, do we control our stress and our response to stressful situations, things and people? I've enclosed in this newsletter ways to handle stress. But realize that not all stress is bad. Stress can help us direct energy toward action, change and growth. Stress of course can have a negative influence. It can lead to feelings of frustration, anger and tension. It can turn sadness into depression.

Negative stress may lead to health problems or make them worse. Here are some: headaches, migraines, insomnia, high blood pressure, heart disease. Stress takes a toll on relationships and makes us cranky.

So, what are we to do?? We will always be put in potentially stressful situations. We do have a choice in how we react.

One of the things I have found to be helpful is to start each day by jotting down a couple of things or people I'm grateful for and saying a short prayer of thanks. Often we forget to acknowledge the good in our lives. We can exaggerate the importance of pressures put on us. My mother used to ask, "Are you making a mountain out of a mole hill?" I picked up along the, "If it won't make a dif-

ference one way or the other in five years, don't worry about it." If things don't turn out just so, it's ok. In five years, will others even remember their Christmas gift? Probably not. But, they may remember what a joy it was to be with you during t5he holidays.

Let's turn to the Gospel to put things in perspective, the familiar story of Mary and Martha (Luke 10:40-42). "But Martha was distracted by all the preparations that had to be made. She came to him and asked, "Lord don't you care that my sister has left me to do the work by myself? Tell her to help me!" "Martha, Martha" the Lord answered, "you are worried and upset about many things, but only one thing is needed. Mary has chosen what is better and it will not be taken away from her."

Lets fill our hearts and minds with the spirit of peace, joy and faith this Christmas season and focus on the one thing that is needed.
