Nurses Notes	6	The Twelve Days of Christmas is probably the most misunderstood part of the church year among Christians who are not part of liturgical church traditions. Con- trary to much popular belief, these are not the twelve days before Christmas, but in	
God's Yellow 7 Pages		most of the Western Church are the twelve days from Christmas until the beginning of Epiphany (January 6th); the 12 days count from December 25th until January 5th). In some traditions, the first day of Christmas begins on the evening of Decem- ber 25th with the following day considered the First Day of Christmas (December 26th). In these traditions, the twelve days begin December 26 and include Epiphany on January 6.	
Special Points of Interest:		The popular song "The Twelve Days of Christmas" is usually seen as simply a non-

However, some have suggested that it is a song of Christian instruction, perhaps dating to the 16th century religious wars in England, with hidden references to the basic teachings of the Christian Faith. They contend that it was a mnemonic device to teach the catechism to youngsters. The "true love" mentioned in the song is not an earthly suitor, but refers to God Himself. The "me" who receives the presents refers to every baptized person who is part of the Christian Faith. Each of the "days" represents some aspect of the Christian Faith that was important for children to learn. This explanation though not authenticated by all historical accounts is more than an Urban legend and may indeed be the hid- den meaning behind this popular song. What do you think?

Each of you received the letter this month regarding your Estimate of Giving for 2018. We need your responses by January 7 in order to prepare the church budget for Council approval in late January.
