Strength for the Journey

Paul writes this to the church at Philippi from a jail cell in Rome. He had no personal income, no savings account, no IRA, no social security. His needs were met by the generosity of the churches he served, or he went without. He describes his prison time in *4:12 I have experienced times of need and times of abundance.*

Paul describes the ebb and flow of the events of his life. He speaks of times of need where his resources were scarce and times of abundance where he had his needs met and more than he needed. There are times in our lives and the life of our church when we have seen our needs as greater than our resources. We also remember those other times when we have enough for ourselves and more, when we experience a time of plenty in our lives, a time when life is going well. Acts of generosity abound, but how can you be generous in the lean times? Paul gives us two simple principles to follow that will encourage our hearts to be generous at all times.

He says he has learned contentment. First, he has learned to be thankful towards God in all of life circumstances. Second, he has learned not to envy those who have more than he does. *4:12b In any and every circumstance I have learned the secret of contentment, whether I go satisfied or hungry, have plenty or nothing.* His secret is his confidence in Jesus and the power of the Holy Spirit so that by faith he can say, *4:13 I am able to do all things through the one who strengthens me.* He can do all things God requires of Him, because God strengthens him. Whatever God calls him to do, he can do it because God has an infinite supply of resources. *4:19 And my God will supply your every need according to his glorious riches in Christ Jesus.* God supplies all of our needs not out of His resources a finite supply, but according to His riches in Christ Jesus an infinite supply. He acts on our behalf for His glory. *4:20 May glory be given to God our Father forever and ever. Amen.*

June 7 Parking Lot Service & Farewell to Pastor Victor and Patrice

We are planning on having a parking lot service on Sunday, June 7 at 9:30 AM. **In case of inclement weather, the service will be canceled.** Future worship services are still being determined. We will update you as soon as possible.

The guidelines we need to follow for the parking lot service are as follows:

- Each household should be in a separate car; carpooling does not comply with social distancing.
- Everyone should wear a face mask while in your vehicle (there will be some available to those who don't have one).
- When in cars, we need to park 6 feet apart because windows will be rolled down.
- If you have any Covid-19 symptoms (cough, fever, shortness of breath, etc.) **PLEASE do not attend.**
- Worship service will be short.
- There should be no passing of objects or physical contact between households.

We will also have a short farewell to Pastor Victor and Patrice after this service because the following Sunday, June 14, will be their last Sunday with us. Cupcakes and bottled water will be served. There will be a basket set up if you would like to drop in a gift or card for the Waters family. Again, we need you to remember to wear your face mask and maintain 6 feet social distance.

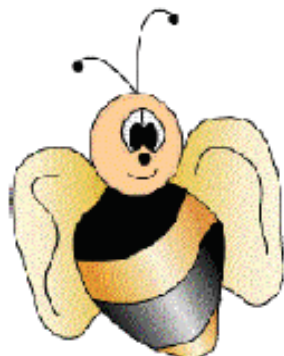
