

A Positive Financial Update

As you know, there were many years over the past twenty that Faith Church was unable to pay any of its apportionments and other years when we paid only half or a bit more. Our Conference keeps track of that deficit that reached well over \$100 thousand. In 2019, with your help, we were able to pay 100% of our apportionments of approximately \$21,000. These apportionments are an important part of our obligations as members of the Minnesota Annual Conference.

We recently received a letter from the Annual Conference that acknowledged our 2019 full payment and further states that "We have released \$28,755.74 for 2019. This leaves a remaining balance of \$86,267.22."

"This release is based on the policy of the Annual Conference that allows a release of a church's prior year unpaid apportionments whenever a church pays100% of its current year apportionment amount. This process is automatic. ...we automatically release 25% of the unpaid amount from prior years."

Our 2020 apportionments total \$20,869 included in the approved operating budget. We have already paid \$10,000 of that amount and so far, have been able to pay all of our bills. If everyone pays their 2020 pledges or otherwise gives the estimated amounts we included in our budget planning (based on prior giving), we should be able to pay 100% of our apportionments again this year. This is impressive during these challenging times.

Knowing that there are many sacrifices each one of us is already making, hopefully we can find a way as the Faith Church congregation to continue our support of 100% payment of our apportionments. These apportionments benefit our Church as whole, and the financial benefit to our church is very significant.

Advent 2020
