Six Rules or Guidelines for Reading God's Word

1. Practice Daily.

By submitting to this discipline, we become rooted in Scripture and it takes root in us.

2. Go Small.

By moving through small portions at a time, we are able to focus our minds and hearts more intentionally, and soak in what we are reading.

3. Listen and Obey.

Read with a focused purpose to know the will of God and a fixed resolution to do it. Ask for the wisdom to understand God's direction and the courage to obey it.

4. Follow the Story.

The great themes run like a thread through the Bible. Keep watch for them. How does the passage at hand point to the larger story?

5. Pray.

The same Holy Spirit who inspired the writing of Scripture continues to inspire the reading of it today. Begin your reading with prayer for understanding. End your time with prayer for application and transformation. Ask that the seeds of truth will give way to the fruit of growth.

6. Pause and Act.

When finished we should pause and reflect on what we have heard and what it means for our lives. Then in humble obedience we should actively live it out.

Wesley, the founder of Methodism, placed a high value on knowing the teachings of Scripture and being mindful to obey them. Study of Scripture can seem like a daunting task. These six simple rules/guidelines I hope will encourage you to make a daily practice of reading the Bible as you pursue a deeper knowledge of Jesus.

Nurse's Notes-It's Confidential

One definition of confidential is privileged communication shared with only a few people. Receiver of confidential information is generally prohibited from using it.

Often we think of a lawyer or doctor or clergyman as being held to such a standard. All of us, at one time or another, have been the recipient of confidential information. You are told important things while you are alone together or in a very small group. Why are you told? Because the person sharing considers you trustworthy, that you won't be a tale-bearer. Often, you are told to keep what was said in confidence. Other times, you <u>must ask</u>. In your quest to be helpful, you may "spill the beans" to other concerned persons. Or it just spills out. Think before sharing! Be on guard for storytelling. If you receive information about someone, ask if it's confidential or to be shared. If in doubt, refrain from telling others.

We are called to be our Brother's Keeper. I bet it includes their confidence.

Prayer: "God help us to be trustworthy. Help us discern what should be told and what shouldn't be shared. Amen."

Proverbs 11:13: He who goes about as a talk bearer reveals secrets, But he who is trustworthy conceals a matter.

Proverbs 2:11: Discretion will guard you, understanding will watch over you.
