From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Ones,

I was having lunch one recent Sunday after worship and fellowship when I received a call from one of our local nursing homes. A nurse explained to me that they had a resident who was actively dying. She said that the family had told her that this resident, didn't attend church but was a Methodist. The nurse asked if I would come and pray with the resident. Of course, I said yes. When I got to the resident's room, they were sleeping peacefully. They looked very comfortable and content. Their breathing was soft, slow and steady. I sat with the resident, took their hand and prayed. I prayed that Jesus would guide them safely from this life to the next. I prayed a thanksgiving over their life, and I prayed for their family. Then I sat quietly with them for a while and left my card for the family in case they needed me.

In my twenty plus years of ministry, being with the dying and their families have been the most holy and blessed times. In these moments, I have felt like I was a conduit of God's love and the grace and peace of Jesus. I know many of you have had this experience as well. It can be an uncomfortable time, wondering what to say, what to do, but the most important thing is to simply be present. Saying nothing and just being there. Sometimes, when in the home of someone who is dying, and their family is gathered round, I find a corner, out of the way to simply be present. Maybe they will want me to pray, maybe not, I am there to provide the support they need and simply remind them they are loved by God and God will walk with them through their grief.

Times such as these remind me of the seasons of life we all go through. They are so much like the seasons of the year we experience. Now, in the season of fall, we experience many changes, the temperatures are falling as are the leaves, but not before showing us their majestic colors. Every season has its highlights, things we look forward to and the same is true of our seasons of life. We may not want to think about it, but there comes a time when we all will walk through "the valley of the shadow of death" but remember, "Thou art with me, thy rod and thy staff, they comfort me" we are not alone in this season, and what waits for us is more beautiful than we can imagine. And so we ask, "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?"

And so, as I sit with one of God's beautiful children, as watch as they slowly make the transition into glory, I give thanks for Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. I know who I am, and whose I am, and can walk confidently into the future, knowing my Lord is by my side.
