Jesus asked His disciples a more important question. "What's in your heart?" Worry and anxiety over the present, the past and the future or trust, deep abiding trust in the provision of God for your needs now and future,

22 And he said to his disciples, "Therefore I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you will eat, nor about your body, what you will put on. 23 For life is more than food, and the body more than clothing. 24 Consider the ravens - they neither sow nor reap, they have neither storehouse nor barn, and yet God feeds them. Of how much more value are you than the birds! 25 And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life. Luke 12:22-25

Many of us have read this passage from Luke and looked at Our Lord's advice as optional. I don't worry about most things, but then there is my money, my health, my job, my family, my church. It seems the moment something or someone becomes "mine" then I have to protect them, look after them and make sure nothing happens to them.

So we half-way trust God, we mouth the words and say the right things, but we live as if the care of all we have is really in our hands. We hold on tight, we clutch, we grab on for dear life and woe to the person or persons who get in our way. As a result, we are always on guard. We are always waiting for the next shoe to drop. We never fully relax, we never trust God with our whole hearts.

Suppose all of those thing or people in our life were no longer ours but His. My money is His money, my health is His health, my job is His job, my family is His family, my church is His church.

Then we would know the reality of Paul's advice to the Philippian Church. "6 Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:6-8

In the weeks to come, we will all be challenged to "Get out of the Boat" to leave our place of security and embark on a challenging, costly and risky journey of discipleship. And what is our reward for stepping out into the storm? We get Jesus! All He has and all He is and He will be all we need. So come and let us journey together towards the joy of knowing Jesus and the power of His resurrection.

Reflections from the Choir Director

As I enter my 40th year as your choir director, I want to share with you and teach you some of the church terms and vocabulary that is unfamiliar to some people. A choir is a group of dedicated singers who serve the Lord through their music. We are song leaders and help with the worship service. During the early years, we sang our <u>introit</u> or call to worship that is intended to prepare us for worship. Later on I selected call-to-worships that would introduce you to new music from *The Faith We Sing* and other contemporary resources. (Pretty sneaky, wasn't I?) When it became too difficult to sing from the balcony and process (walk down the aisle), we decided to remain in the choir loft. There were lots of reasons for this change—noise level, bad legs, etc. During the early years, there was a lot of music. We sang responses after the scripture reading, after the pastor's prayer, and at the benediction (closing). Some pastors liked to use a lot of music during the service, others not so much.

I'm often asked why we wear robes. I consider the choir to be a group just like school choirs and a sports team. They all wear robes or uniforms because they are a special group. Our choir is very special to me. Why do we sit in a choir loft? To be honest, we sound better. We are on a raised level for a reason. We hear each other better and project to you. We have had lots of problems due to the location of the piano and have had to adjust accordingly. I used to have the choir come down to the steps so I could communicate better with the accompanist. It worked for me, but as our choir ages, this doesn't always work and I will never please everybody. I will never turn anyone away from singing and praising God.

What is an <u>anthem</u>? Simply, it is the choir's song that they sing to enhance the worship experience. I work very hard at selecting music that the congregation will enjoy as well as to "show-off" the talents of the choir. In this age of 'entertainment,' people believe that the church should only perform contemporary and hard rock music. I believe in blended worship and choose music from any style that is singable and can relate to the listener's needs.

Our choir is a great group to work with, and I am sure each member has some stories to tell you. I will share one humorous event with you. One Easter Sunrise Service we combined the choirs from Congregational and EUM churches, so the choir loft was maxed out. My unborn son decided to make it known that he was around and soon I had legs and arms distorting my huge belly. The girls next to me got the giggles and pretty soon the whole soprano row was shaking with laughter. My son was born the following Sunday, 33 years ago.

The choir and I have adapted to many, many changes over the years and there will be more. I enjoy working with this amazing group. They know that at my old age, I like coming to church to feel comfortable, to feel the presence of God, and praise Him through music. However, God may have to use a two ton anchor around my neck and throw me overboard to get me out of the boat. My faith is very personal to me. I have grown immensely since I was born and raised in this family of God. Be patient with me, God's still working on me.

 - 5. Prepare yourself to respond to God's call

- 1. Where have you seen the ordinary and extraordinary. Check every two weeks
- 2. What brings you deep joy God wants you to enjoy what you are doing. The joy doesn't wear off with time.
- 3. You wear it well; your gift suits you.
- 4. It comes natural to you.
- 5. Still wondering? Ask two friends what your gifts are.
- 6. Step out with courage! God's right here with you.
- 7. Your gifts are given to you to be used!
