Proverbs 1: 2 To know wisdom and instruction, to understand words of insight,
3 to receive instruction in wise dealing, in righteousness, justice, and equity; 4
to give prudence to the simple, knowledge and discretion to the youth—

Tim Keller in his commentary on Proverbs defines wisdom in this way ... Biblical wisdom, however, brings discernment to the skill of the daily living of life itself. Wisdom discerns multiple dimensions to people's motives and character, rather than putting everyone into the binary categories of "good people" and "bad people." Discernment is also the ability to tell the difference not just between right and wrong but also among good, better, and best.
